From "KHKOB" she sent me a beautiful gold and silver cup with the inscription "To my dear Harold on his birthday 18/5/61"

Very nice, huh? She is sweet.

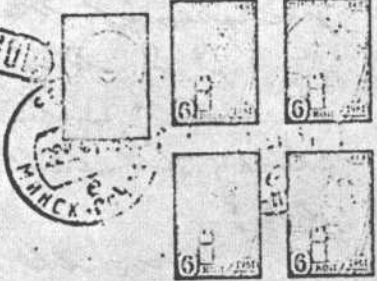
